- Instituted 360 annual budgeting process to promote accountability among business unit leaders, yielding a more informed and accurate annual budget; drove business unit leaders to identify inefficiencies
- Designed and instituted Company's first performance-based bonus plan to properly incentivize for profitability
- Spearheaded redesign of employee benefits programs to align with market, saving the Company \$2 million annually while also negotiating a 50% reduction in administrative fees for healthcare benefits
- Augmented operational finance function with strategically built FP&A team, increasing productivity across financial and accounting teams while providing management with more actionable data for decision-making
- Implemented automated AP solution and HRIS system, resulting in overhead savings of 20%
- Serve on the Governance, Risk & Compliance Committee, the body tasked with corporate oversight of the Company's multi-arena compliance and risk monitoring efforts
